

Then and only then can we respond, "*Yes, Lord, we are utilizing the gifts and talents that we've been given to glorify You to the fullest extent in the time You have given us on this earth.*"

The following pages show the many ways to be involved at St. Paul's. The list is in alphabetical order. ADULT FAITH FORMATION Al Pompeo 330-542-3466

The Parish invites all adults to attend Faith Formation Enrichment throughout the year. These include three morning sessions as well as evening sessions during Advent and Lent.

ALTAR GUILD Denise Gentile 330-542-9474 Members of the Altar Guild engage in charitable works for those in our parish community. They engage in community-building socials. They offer financial support to the parish, especially for liturgical and environment needs. Meetings are usually the first Monday of the month.

ALTAR SERVERS

Once a young boy or girl is in the fourth grade, he/she may step forward to serve Mass. Training sessions are held on an annual basis for children who want to learn to serve. Servers are asked to be available for weekend Masses and some weddings. Adults serve weekday Masses. Scheduling is up to each individual. Servers are scheduled every three months.

BEREAVEMENT

Barb Bartolovich 330-757-4633 Members of this Committee correspond with the deceased's family with a care package and by writing cards to them periodically throughout the next year on dates that have been proven to be important. The parish supplies cards and the Committee member assigned to a family is asked, if possible, to make a visit at the funeral home. As part of our annual All Souls Day Commemoration, a Mass of Remembrance will be offered for those who died within the year. The families of those who died will be invited to participate in this Mass in a special way.

CATHOLIC CONNECTION

A number of area parishes collaborate on adult faith formation opportunities including the DINNER AND DOCTRINE series and FIRST FRIDAY. We meet to share a meal and hear a guest speaker on topics relating to our faith. Check the bulletin for upcoming events.

PRAYER GROUP

Our prayer group meets once a week, usually on Tuesday evenings, to pray for any needs brought to its attention by word of mouth or by intentions placed in the parish prayer box. All gatherings begin with praise songs and Scripture. The prayer box is brought forth during the *Preparation of the Gifts* and mentioned during the *General Intercession* at each Mass on the weekend. You are most welcome to attend, to observe, and/or to participate in the prayer meeting, which lasts usually one hour.

EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS Gloria Farrow 330-542-3466 Ministers of the Eucharist assist during Mass in the sharing and distribution of communion, both the Body and the Blood of the Lord. Some Eucharistic Ministers also assist in bringing communion to the sick and homebound. Scheduling is up to each volunteer. After prayer and discernment, being a Eucharistic Minister can begin after one's Confirmation.

EVANGELIZATION Al Pompeo 330-542-3466 Reaching out to members of our parish community and beyond to strengthen their relationship with Christ is an important part of our faith. The Evangelization Committee plans events that bring Christ to the entire parish. The group meets regularly to plan evangelization opportunities.

over. They meet the 2nd Monday of each month at 12:30 pm (for lunch as well)
and plan local trips and social events.

<u>FINANCIAL COUNCIL</u> Fr. Stephen Zeigler 330-542-3466 The financial security and planning of a large parish community like St. Paul's is one of the most moral and ethical responsibilities we have. People entrust us with their financial offering to support the work of God. This committee meets four times a year to review financial planning, investments, spending, and overall security of the people's financial gifts to God.



GARDEN ANGELS Irene Scullen 330-542-1143 Each year, selected outside areas on the church property are put up for "adoption." Once an individual, a family, a group of friends, or a parish organization adopts an area, they agree to plant flowers, weed, and maintain the area during the summer months. This is a major contribution to the beauty of the parish grounds. While the parish would certainly reimburse individuals for their purchase (s), most donate their time and money to keep our gardens growing.

GIFTING PROGRAM

HOMEBOUND VISITATION Call Rectory 330-542-3466 Each week, these volunteers go "two-by-two" to visit our homebound. Communion is also shared, so most on this committee are Eucharistic Ministers as well. We help the homebound feel connected to the parish and our activities.

HOSPITALITY

Hospitality is people making people feel welcome. This ministry encompasses welcoming people who are attending Mass, assisting with seating, offertory needs, and collection, or any practical/formal needs of the people before, during, or after the Mass. We are also responsible for taking up the collection, passing out bulletins, and helping those who might become ill. Each person in the parish is called upon to demonstrate our spirit of welcome!



Jerry Wansack 330-542-2583 The Knights is a fraternal lay organization for men devoted to the advancement of Catholic action, committed especially to the promotion of Catholic Education through endowments. They are responsible for fund-raising socials, and help with projects that involve the church buildings and surrounding grounds as needed. They meet once a month.

LECTORS Gloria Farrow 330-542-3466 These men and women are readers of God's Holy Word at Mass. Lectors are responsible for the effective proclamation of the Scriptures. We encourage lectors to prepare by meditating and praying over the Scriptures to be proclaimed. Lectors are encouraged to attend workshops, retreats, and prayerful opportunities that will deepen their ability to understand and experience God through the Word they proclaim. New lectors are generally sought each year. Anyone who can demonstrate a good reading ability is welcome. Scheduling is up to each lector.

LITURGY COMMITTEE Rosalie D'Angelo 330-542-3100 The holy space in which we worship and the setting we find as we attend church are the results of many creative and generous people.

MENS CATHOLIC FELLOWSHIP Sam Morocco 330-980-4939 This group meets to study and discuss a particular text or Scripture and enter into prayer with the fellowship of adult men in our parish. We meet every other Thursday throughout the year at 7:30 pm in the Gathering Space.



MISSION TEAMAl Pompeo330-542-3466The members of our Mission Team plan our yearly Mission which typically takesplace during the Lenten season. The Mission nourishes the community throughspeakers, prayer, praise, and music.

MUSIC MINISTRY

Rosalie D'Angelo 330-542-3100 The Music Ministry includes our music director, other instrumentalist, Cantors, seasonal family choirs, and special music for Sacramental Liturgies. If you wish to be a part of the music program as a musician or cantor, please let us know. You are also invited to join the holiday or seasonal choirs.



NURSING HOME MINISTRY Call Rectory 330-542-3466 This Ministry celebrates Mass for and with the residents at Hampton Woods and Windsor House the first and third Thursdays at 3:00 pm.

PASTORAL COUNCIL Fr. Stephen Zeigler 330-542-3466 Pastoral Council coordinates the parish's volunteer programs, promotes participation and cooperation among the ministries and offers policy suggestions to our pastor. This Council meets the 3rd Thursday of each month.

PIROHY Call Hall 330-542-3525 Pirohy is set up on Wednesdays and are made on Thursdays and Fridays. Proceeds from our Pirohy (which is the best in town!) help to defray the costs of major church projects throughout the year. Come "pinch" some pirohy with us!

PRAYER BLANKET Virginia Kutchel 330-542-0224 This program offers a hand-made blanket with a prayer to those in need of healing for any reason. Please pick up your blanket and prayer in the Sacristy in the cabinet marked "Prayer Blankets."

PRISON OUTREACH

Fran May 330-549-5283

This ministry visits those in jail to pray with them, offer communion, and provide their spiritual needs during this time.

RCIA

Bill McMahon 330-5423466 This stands for Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. One can be a part of RCIA as a formal teacher or as a support person. Those adults interested in becoming Catholic, who need a Sacrament, or would like to learn more about the Faith or deepen and renew their faith should call Bill at the Rectory. Sacraments of Initiation are usually celebrated at the Easter Vigil.



RESPECT LIFE Al Pompeo 330-542-3466 Respect Life offers literature throughout the year. The month of October is designated for this ministry and money is collected during this time. Please check out the Gathering Space Boards and the Bulletin.

ROSARY Vera (Vee) Slifka 330-542-2808 This group visits the nursing homes once a week at 2:00 pm for one half hour to pray the Rosary and the Litany of the Blessed Mother.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL Fran May 330-549-5283 The St. Vincent de Paul Society serves the poor in the area. On designated dates throughout the year, members of St. Paul's serve at the St. Vincent de Paul Soup Kitchen in downtown Youngstown.

SILAS MARNERS

Iack Ohlin 330-542-1244 These volunteers gather every Monday morning to count the weekend collection. These men and women rotate responsibilities every few months.




SPONSOR COUPLES Al Pompeo 330-542-3466 These married couples use their marital experience to work with engaged couples in preparation for marriage.

STCCC Georgie Shane 330-542-3466 St. Paul's is a member of the Springfield Township Council of Churches and Community (STCCC or the 3 C's). This ecumenical outreach organization is a covenant group of local churches representing the different denominations in our area. This group of men and women strive to address local concerns and problems while promoting common worship opportunities, as well as service to the poor and needy.

TABLE OF PLENTY Fran May 330-549-5283 Together with two other church communities, this ministry provides meals the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Tuesdays of each month. St. Paul's is responsible for the 2nd Tuesday of the month. Different ministries within the church plan, prepare, and serve the meal.

PSR (Parish, School & Religion) Al Pompeo 330-542-3466 The PSR student sessions run from September through Easter and are held from 9:00 am until 10:15 am, enabling everyone to also attend the 10:30 am Mass. These sessions are for Pre-K through 8th grade. We teach about our faith, share in prayer, sing songs, and serve the community together through our community service projects.



WELCOMING COMMITTEE Cindy Clemente 330-707-9800 New families are recognized by our parish with their names hung on the banner in the Gathering Space for all to see. This committee ensures new members are recognized in our parish.

WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDYCall Rectory330-542-3466This ladies group meets Wednesday morning from 9:00 am until 10:30am September through May. They study Scripture, share the Word, and enjoyfellowship.
